From the Interim Pastor

For my article I am going to steal some words that someone else wrote in a sermon some time ago. This is the end of her sermon and I will quote from her and then I will tell you who the writer is.

Paul the writer of the book of Ephesians wants the early Christians to know, that even despite pain, suffering, hardships, and doubts, God has provided us the strength and faith we need. The breastplate of righteousness and the shield of faith deflects the arrows that Satan may shoot our way. With proper foot wear, we carry God's truth wherever we go. And the last two, I rely on the most: the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit which is the word of God. I saw a t-shirt once that said, Life is Hard; Wear a Helmet. The helmet of salvation protects our brain, our decision maker. So when the question, should I stay or should I go comes up—it is a no brainer. Why? The sword of the spirit, the word of God tells us the truths we need to hear. It's not sugar coated. It's not easy. Like the disciples who left complained—This is a difficult word; who can accept it? But with the Bible, the sword of the spirit, we can know we are saved by grace. We can pray for God to reveal himself to us, to help us to believe in ways that only make sense to us. We can answer with Peter: Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Amen.

The writer of these words is Terry Nelson. This is a sermon she wrote on the  $6^{th}$  chapter of Ephesians several years ago. This is the book we have been reading through these past several weeks in worship. And the writer of Ephesians meant for this letter to be circulated to all the early Christian churches. What Terry wrote here is meant as a conclusion about how we respond to what God has already given to us. And I think that she nailed it.

Take a look for yourself at the equipment that God gives to us in the 6<sup>th</sup> chapter of Ephesians and how it helps us to live in this world and to be God's loving servants. We are not alone neither are we defenseless against the hardships of life. We are well protected and loved.

#### This Good Neighbor Feeds Delphos.....

St. Peter Lutheran Church's InReach/OutReach & Their Kid's Summer Breakfast Program Written by Laura Hayford

What constitutes a good neighbor? For some it may be a person or family who lives close by you and you find to be helpful and courteous. For some the idea of a good neighbor may suggest a person in a neighborhood, or community, who you know you can rely on to make it a better place to live. For your August edition of Delphos Aware LLC Online Magazine, we are recognizing a group of people, with roots in a local congregation, as our "good neighbor".

On any given weekday morning during the summer months, while school is out, you will find a congregation of children and adults at St. Peter Lutheran Church on Pierce Street in Delphos. A smathering of bicycles may be parked by the church sign and muffled sounds of children's laughter and footballs may drift out to greet you at the open entry doors. You might expect this congregation to be in worship, but they are in fellowship—for breakfast.

This is the ninth year St. Peter Lutheran's InReach/OutReach team has hosted the Kid's Summer Breakfast program. Susan McGue started and heads up this extraordinary opportunity for children and adults to come to the church and get a hot, nutritious breakfast.

What stood out to me most was the precision and organized manner to which each volunteer did their part. The kitchen, dining and serving areas are set up to provide a dining experience much like you would find at a restaurant. Even the patrons, the children and adults who come to eat and visit with each other, know what is expected of them while they are here dining.

When a guest of the breakfast program arrives, they stop at a table at the entry and fill out their order for breakfast. While they are filling out their breakfast order--which menu options change on daily-they also have the option to fill out a take home sack lunch request. On the first day I visited, the breakfast menu included pancakes with assorted options such as plain, chocolate chips, peanut butter chips, both chocolate and peanut butter chips, or blueberries. You could also get cereal. On Wednesdays, what I am told is a popular day, the breakfast menu includes pancakes with either chocolate chips or blueberries or scrambled eggs with cheese as an option, and a meat, or cereal, and toast and it was very tasty!

Every day the children can take home a sack lunch, too. The options for the sack lunch stay the same every day and include choices of a sandwich or a pancake and you can select two items. The sandwich choices are peanut butter only, peanut butter with jelly or jelly only sandwich. You can also take home 1 or 2 pancakes--either plain, blueberry, or chocolate chip. You can also mix one pancake with one sandwich. (continued next page)

Therefore, there really is no need for any child to go hungry, when school is out, in Delphos! According to the United States Department of Agriculture 13.1 million children under the age of 18 in the United States live in households where they are unable to consistently access enough nutritious foods for a healthy life. The St. Peter Lutheran InReach/OutReach Team provides breakfast and lunch options for all children, and any adult they bring with them, regardless of household income and without any questions or requirements. For many of these kids, meeting up for breakfast to see their friends is a big draw. This program provides a save place for children to get tasty food and good company. The children know they are expected to return their plates and silverware to a designated area and clean them off for the kitchen staff who will be washing them. They also know they need to push their chairs in and leave their areas neat and tidy.

Susan McGue says, "This program runs strictly on donations and no one get turned away. It takes quite a few volunteers to make this run efficiently. Some days of the week require more volunteers than others because of the food items on the menu. Wednesdays are our busiest days as we have scrambled eggs and meats." A lot of the volunteers are St. Peter Lutheran Church members. The Delphos Public Library and K&M Tire send volunteers, too. Chad Beechwood of K&M Tire was volunteering at the drink table and said, "I like volunteering and helping people. I like to give back." Many of the volunteers were very busy working so I didn't get to talk to them much.

I did a little survey and asked the kids whet they liked the best about the Kid's Summer Breakfast Program. The results varied from, "I like the yummy food," and "I love the multiple choice" or "I like their chocolate milk" to a jubilant "Pancakes!" All the respondents answered with a bright smile on their faces, of course.

You can catch Susan and all the volunteers cooking up some yummy food and joyful kids and parents enjoying every bite of it from 8:00 am to 9:00 am, weekday mornings through August 17<sup>th</sup>. Stop in, say, "Hi" and meet some very good neighbors, indeed!
