From the Interim Pastor

The fall is my favorite time of year even though where I live we have a lot of leaves to rake. I love the cool air and there is such beauty in this time of changing seasons. This is also the time of year that I began as your Interim pastor and I can see some changes that may come this year.

My primary task with you has always been to help prepare you for your next pastor. At our council meeting this past month I shared some thoughts I have about this. I am now beginning my fifth year with you and this will probably be my last. I am hoping that a neighboring congregation will finally open up and that you can share a pastor with them. There is a good possibility for this and we have been waiting for them to be ready.

I also have the help of two other Lutheran pastors who are not available for Interim work but they can fill in on Sundays. Pastor Bob Gibson from Elida and Pastor Mark Bauer from Wapakoneta are available for Sunday worship. I think it will be helpful for you to experience their style of leading worship and preaching to remind you that there are a variety of pastors out there and many of them are very good. I have known Bob and Mark for a long time and I have a lot of respect for both of them.

I have asked them to take one Sunday each month. They will do this as they can which means that you might have both in one month or just one. Either way, I know you will enjoy them and this will give you some variety. At the same time this will give me the opportunity to take my wife away for a weekend to help renew her spirits for teaching.

We will see what the coming year will bring. Please know that I will continue to be with you during the week and for any time that you need me.

Another change that may be coming from the church council is putting the question to you on whether or not to sell the parsonage. In the November newsletter you will get their recommendation as well as information about the value of the parsonage. Repairs have been made to the parsonage and it is currently in good shape. Also the market is ripe for selling houses right now and that makes this an appropriate time to ask this question. At our December congregational meeting on the budget for the coming year, you will be asked to make a decision on whether to keep the parsonage or to sell it.

In the meantime, you are welcome to talk with any council member and ask them your questions.

We know that like the seasons, change will come to us. We know that winter might be wet and cold but we also know that Spring will once again give us new life. This is also what God promises us as well. Regardless of the changes God promises to be with us through it all and will guide us into new life.

The property committee has explored the possibility of selling the parsonage located on Scott Street. We looked into the cost of yearly upkeep and maintenance. The house has to be constantly checked for water, heat/cooling, plumbing and other issues. Something always needs taken care of. In the winter snow needs taken care of, sidewalks and driveways need cleaned, in the summer it's weeds and mowing.

We have yearly expenses of taxes, insurance and monthly water and sewer bill, electric bill. These expenses come to nearly (\$5000.00) five thousand dollars a year.

In the past, having a parsonage for your pastor and family was a blessing and bonus for calling a pastor to serve us. It was a tool that no longer is a benefit to be used for calling a pastor.

After discussion with interim Pastor Steve and his wife, we discovered on the pastors side, it is not a benefit as the Pastor has no means of building equity and it actually costs them money on taxes of income.

Due to the current state of being able to find a calling for a full time pastor to serve us and due to the current status our most likely scenario of calling a pastor, we are leaning toward a shared ministry as congregation sizes all over are shrinking in numbers, we most likely will be sharing a pastor.

Due to these facts, it was recommended to/by the committee to sell the property and was voted on and passed by council to sell the parsonage.

The property was re-surveyed, and we will retain 50 % of the back yard between the garage and the back of the sanctuary. We will maintain a written agreement with the sale and with Dave Sterling for total use of the driveway to access our property from Scott Street.

The property was appraised at \$160,000.00 (one hundred sixty thousand) and the market is strong right now. We should net around one hundred forty thousand (\$140000.00) after the sale.

This will be voted on at the annual congregation meeting the first part of December.


