A Little Bit of This and That from Carol

There are so many things running through my mind to share with you today. First of all, I want to thank you for the opportunity to do ministry with you. God has called us to work together and grow in faith and ministry. You are my new family in Christ and I count that as a great blessing. In the little time that I have been here, I can see the treasure you have in faith traditions and in working together. God is here, present, dwelling in your midst. You are the body of Christ and what a gift you are.

I want to also thank you for being a part of the commissioning service on September 12th that now allows me to serve as your Synodically Authorized Minister. This oath to serve you and God is not one that I take lightly and I will continue to covet your prayers as I journey with you. I will be sharing things that I am learning in my coursework at Pacific Lutheran Seminary and at times I imagine that we will be asked to stretch as the content in the coursework requires more reflection and mission driven focus to connect with those in our community. I am excited about the journey, but also a little nervous. I have much to learn and this year a part of my main focus will be to get to know you individually and to learn and understand how you do things at St. Peter.

I also want to thank all of you who made the receptions for my commissioning service and for Pastor Steve's last Sunday so nice. It is humbling to be so cared for. Thank you. I also want to reiterate that I heard several say how wonderful it was to fellowship over food with one another. There were happy joyful sounds of a community of believers sharing life together and truly enjoying the wonderful food and fellowship.

My coursework will require that I spend the week of October 14-19 in intensive study in Indianapolis with my cohort of fellow team candidates and our professors. If you have an emergency during this time, you may call me on my cell phone, 419-512-4490, and I can arrange pastoral care based on the situation.

In this last year, Bishop Beaudoin has encouraged us all to read the Bible through. I am finding that one of the gifts of reading the Bible through this year is to more fully understand how much God created us to be in relationship with him. I used to think that the God of the Old Testament was ruthless and not so loving, but now I have begun to see that God is a jealous God who wants his created people to be in relationship with him. He is all about relationship. He did some pretty ruthless things to punish the Jewish people to get them to turn back to him and those passages are difficult to read, but ultimately God decided to make the ultimate sacrifice of his son to allow us to be reconciled to him. Now that is love! This also makes me so happy that we no longer have to have animal sacrifices to atone for our sins. Jesus has given his life for us and in that gift we have been adopted as beloved children of God. It is God who has reached down to love us. Like the Jewish people, we still mess up, but God is always there to reconcile us to him.

Last week in my mentor session with Pastor Melodi Hagen, she shared that she thinks of communion as a way to not only receive the blood and body of our Lord Jesus, but that the remembering is also important in that when we take communion we are re-membered or

connected to Christ and all the saints as opposed to the feeling that we sometimes get when we feel dis-membered during the week.

In the book, "The Mission Table", that I was reading for class, the author Stephen P. Bouman wrote of a story of a little boy whose mother had died and later the grandmother who was now raising him took him to the early church service on a Sunday. When the service was over, the little boy asked to stay for the second service. When the pastor later asked the boy why he wanted to stay for the second service, the little boy responded that his mother was present at communion and he wanted to be near her. This re-connection was at work in the sacrament of Holy Communion. This makes me think of communion in a different light. It is not only a sacrament in which Jesus is made present to us, but all the saints join in. So, the celebration of communion is truly a celebration!

As we come together to receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ may we always remember that we are surrounded by a wonderful cloud of witnesses.
