

Greetings! It is hard to believe that we are already entering the season of Advent. This season is a time of waiting in expectation for Jesus, but so often we get so scattered in making our preparations that we do not take time to sit and wait and to ponder the wonderful gift of God in allowing the incarnate Jesus to come and dwell among us. We get so busy decorating for the season and shopping for gifts and attending various Christmas events, that we can lose the joy due to the hectic pace of trying to get everything done.

Some years we are so relieved when the seasons of Advent and Christmas are over because we can then get back to our normal routines. On another note, Bob Ulm is inviting people from the various churches to come to his house on December 8 at 1:00 PM, in order to go out and spread joy by Christmas caroling together. I think it would be wonderful if we could respond to come make a joyful noise as we spread the joy of the season. You do not have to be a great singer to do this. The event is about gathering the community together to bring joy to others. So, come and make a joyful noise and join in the fun. We will be having the 4:00 PM and the 10:00 PM Christmas Eve services this year. I am looking forward to being with you on Christmas Eve. Usually these services are some of my favorite of the year. I love to look out and see the families gathered together and to experience the wonder of the gift of Jesus to the world. I love the traditional carols that we sing and I love to hear the stories of Jesus' birth. I hope you will plan to attend and that we may all welcome the birth of Jesus this Christmas.
