

Christmas Eve Services will be Thursday, December 24th at 4:00 PM and 7:00 PM. We will pre-record the service for the radio so it will be available as well as several other worship opportunities. We will live stream the 4:00 service and again at 7:00 if we experience technical difficulties. We will us the FM transmitter for those who want to social distance in the parking lot and still have the opportunity to take communion.
