Well, it looks like our winter is almost over and we can begin to breathe in the sunshine and warmer temperatures. With the pandemic moving in a positive direction, it looks like we can begin to breathe a little easier as people are getting vaccinated and the numbers of new cases are drastically reduced in our area. One of the things that the pandemic caused us to do was to utilize different ways to gather for worship. The parking lot service was a huge success in allowing us to gather safely up until the weather got cold. The council has voted to have us do a hybrid form of worship when the weather begins to warm up for this spring and summer. We will have indoor worship on the first Sunday of each month and we will go outside in the parking lot so people can gather in their cars or in lawn chairs for worship on the other Sundays of the month. As we enter into this new season of change, I am excited for the church and wanting to move forward after being on hold for the last year. At this time, it looks like we will be able to move forward with Lifewise Academy and Franklin Elementary School to provide character education through the teaching of the gospel. Since our building is closest to the school, the children will have their classes in one of our upstairs Sunday school rooms. We also want to move forward in restarting our youth group for our high school age members and their friends and for Sunday school in the fall. For both of these to happen, we will need to work on painting and fixing up the rooms in the Sunday school section of the building. I would also like to form a committee to plan a reopening celebration for the fall when I expect that we will be more able to optimize the use of the building. If you are interested in being a part of the planning, please let me know.

Last month, I wrote that we would be purchasing a new church management program called Breeze to allow our financial secretary to use a new program for managing each of our giving, but the program does so much more. At some point, we will be sending out invitations for you to log into Breeze with your own account. You will only be able to see your account and you will be able to update your profile. This program will also allow people to participate in online giving should they choose. There is an option for "text giving" as well as regular online giving. There is a fee that is deducted from the church and people will have the option to tack on the additional fee into their giving to help cover the cost, but that is not required. All of the traditional ways of giving to the church will continue and no one needs to worry about online giving if they are not interested in it. It is an option, though, for people who may live out of town or state who wish to support the ministry of the church. It is also a great way to continue to support the church when you are away. I also want to reiterate that Denise will be the only person who has access to the contribution section for the church. You will be able to view your individual giving though. As Lauren, Denise, and I get more comfortable using Breeze, we will begin to invite you to log in and create an account. Look for the invitation to come to your email account. That brings me to another need. We need to update our email account information. Many receive the newsletter, but we do not have an email address for you. If you would like to be able to log in to your profile, we will need a current email address. You can send that information to Lauren Trentman at stpeterdelphos@gmail.com with your name and we will then be able to send you an invitation to access Breeze. Once you log in to your account you will have many options for updating your profile. If you need any assistance at all setting up your account, or maybe have no access to a computer please don't hesitate to ask. We will be more than willing to help you get your account set up and active.

Now that I have rambled on about things that are happening at church, I want to invite you to worship with us for Easter. We will only have one service this year, and you may worship with us in person, through Facebook Live, on the radio, or out in the parking lot. The important thing is to take time to recognize the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ for each of us. It is no small thing that Jesus was willing to suffer, to die, and to raise from the dead. In doing so he conquered death and conquered the evil one who seeks to destroy each of us. We are able to place our trust in this Lamb of God and to move forward in life with the love of Jesus in our hearts and the power of the Holy Spirit to be at work in each of us as we journey. We do not have to be afraid because we can be in relationship with the one who understands our hurts and pains as well as our joys and successes. Jesus is alive for you and for me and that is so worth celebrating. May this Easter bring a new filling of Jesus into each of our hearts that we might begin to more fully understand the gift we have been given.
