A little bit of this and that for August...

I have had so many different thoughts running through my mind to share with you that I really do not know where to begin.

First of all, I will begin a formal internship that will run from September- May during this next school year. Pastor Steve Nelson will be my supervisor. It is hard to believe that I am coming down to the last third of my classes and will complete my internship and be able to be approved for ordination sometime next summer or fall. The time has gone fast.

As a part of my internship, I will need to set 4-8 different goals. Some of those will be personal, but others will depend on my work with you. One of the goals that I have is to look at our vision for the future and to develop a strategic plan to enable us to make our visions a reality. We may then also take a look at our mission statement and see how it aligns with what our focus has been or needs to be for the future. To do this, I would like to have representatives from various committees and I would like to have a cross section of ages that involve our youth up through to some of our oldest members. Everyone's voice is important in this process. There are a few people who have shown interest in this process, but we will need more representation. Please pray about whether God is calling you to be a part of this process.

I have felt a need for us to invest in our youth to have them be more present in the worship experience. Before Covid-19, Shelby Koenig and I were trying to get a high school youth group started. We had met several times and had between 7-9 high schoolers attending. Having a place for our high schoolers to gather is important and the orange room upstairs will eventually be redone to create that space. At some point, I would love to see us begin a high school class where students can look at their faith in light of every day stresses and topics of concern. I would love to have members share their faith journey of how God has helped them in their lives, especially in light of making big decisions that impact one's future.

Sunday School is another focus since we want to create more classes to divide the children into more age groups. Lauren Trentman and Samantha Rode will teach a 3-5 year old class and Carrie Calvelage, Ron Kloeppel, and Jennifer Trentman will continue to work with the 1st- 4th graders. Patti Calvert will teach the 5th- 8th graders and we would like to have one other person teaching with her. One of Jacquie and my concerns in teaching catechism is that often our children who have not taken part in Sunday school lack important Biblical knowledge that helps to provide a foundation for faith development. Therefore, I am asking all of our members to pray about whether they need to take some time on Sunday mornings to attend the adult Sunday school class while their children attend their classes. I have found that attending Sunday school provides rich opportunities to live our faith in community. Attending Sunday school provides time for our

relationships to deepen as we study the scriptures and try to apply them to our everyday lives. Dave Stemen will teach the adult class in the parish hall.

Catechism will start in October and be held on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month from 11:15AM – 12:30 PM. This is for students in grades 7th – 8th. Vicar Carol and Jacquie Fritz will be providing more information and will be hosting a parent meeting in September.

One of the things that I am learning is the power of asking. Often this is something that we fear as we do not want to make someone uncomfortable or we fear rejection. Even so, I am asking you to pray about asking people to consider coming back to church or to ask others who you think might be open to coming to church with you. One of the hardest things is to walk into a church where you have not been. We need to look for ways to be inviting with our neighbors and friends. If we are excited about our church then we need to begin to share that with others. We have a rich tradition of faith and as things begin to reopen, we need to celebrate and invite others to join us in our faith journey. If we never ask, we will never know of the person who is just waiting to be invited.

Finally, as we move through August and begin to look toward fall activities, I invite you to pray daily for God to move in our midst to plant dreams for the future. So often we operate out of a scarcity model and we do not celebrate what we have. God is working in our midst and able to do exceedingly more than we could ever imagine. Come, catch the movement of the Holy Spirit in our midst to be a part of what God wants to accomplish at St. Peter Lutheran Church.

I am excited for the future.

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) is an international non-governmental organization that focuses on sustainable development projects and disaster relief and recovery. The organization was founded in 1945 to collect and send aid to people living in post-World War II Europe. For almost 75 years Lutheran World Relief has carried the original disaster relief mission forward by providing, at different times, knitted quilts, soap, bandages, personal care kits, sewing kits, baby care kits, and school kits. In recent years, LWR has added their Good Gifts Program to assist those in need become self-sustainable. Today, Lutheran World Relief operates in East and West Africa, Latin America, Asia and the Middle East, helping some of the world's poorest communities build the resilience they need to thrive.

The members of St. Peter Lutheran have supported many of the projects of Lutheran World Relief over those 76 years. Soap has been saved, bandages and baby sweaters knitted, quilts sewn, infant supplies collected, and various kinds of kits assembled and sent. Most recently the women of St. Peter have been working on school kits, along with the mission quilts that St. Peter women have made over many decades.

For the next several months, St. Peter Lutheran Church will be gathering items for the School Kits. This time of the year is a very good time to start buying school supplies as most of are on sale before school starts.

Needed for each Lutheran World Relief (LWR) school kit:

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 1/2 "; no loose-leaf paper

ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

ONE pencil sharpener

ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band

ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons

ONE 2 ½" eraser

Special Notes:

Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your congregation's name. LWR provides kits based on need, regardless of religious creed. Religious references may be misinterpreted by the governments of the receiving countries, jeopardizing the delivery to the people who need the items most. Secular symbols such as rabbits, eggs, and poinsettias are acceptable.

Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage. LWR and our overseas partners have access to areas of the world others do not because we are impartial humanitarian organizations. If our intentions are misinterpreted as being politically motivated, it puts our work, our partners and the people we assist at risk.
