

One of the upbeat contemporary songs that I love to listen to is called, "Everything Comes Alive in You." Have you noticed how the earth is coming alive in these last few weeks? The grass is getting greener and this week I even had daffodils blooming in one of my flower beds. Soon the flowering trees will begin to bloom and the trees will begin to sprout new leaves. We will soon hear the constant sound of lawn mowers as the grass begins to grow voraciously.

God, the creator, is active to wake up the land in this season of spring. God is also active to awaken our hearts to God's love for us. In a few weeks we will celebrate Easter. What greater love has God shown for us in that he gave his only begotten son to be mocked, beaten and tried as a common criminal. But that is not the end of the story.

On Palm Sunday we will celebrate Jesus' riding into Jerusalem with people shouting Hosanna and then read about the Passion of Christ as he is falsely accused, mocked, beaten, tried and crucified on a cross. We believe that our salvation is a gift from God because of what Jesus did for us. Jesus' death on the cross was not the end of the story and because of Easter we have hope in the resurrection.

We love the joy of celebrating Easter, but the Lenten journey of Holy Week is often something that people fail to be a part of because understanding the pain of what Jesus experienced for us is hard to hear. But hearing the full story of what Jesus did to allow Easter to occur is important.

We start off with Palm Sunday and then on Maundy Thursday, we have the opportunity to hear Jesus' call to be servants of each other. We strip the altar in preparation for Good Friday. This service is important to recognize the suffering and sacrifice that Jesus made for us.

Because Holy Week is so important in our faith journey, I encourage you to set aside the time to attend Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Then come in joy to celebrate Easter. I'll be looking for you.

Sunday School Choir:

The children did a great job singing on March 20th. They sang He's Got the Whole World in His Hands, Kids of the Kingdom and Love, I'll Love.

They will sing again on April 24.

First Communion Class:

First communion classes will be on April 11th and 20th to prepare students in fourth grade and higher who have not had instruction on first communion. We will learn about this important sacrament as well as the Passover that occurred when the angel of death came to strike down the first born of those in Egypt. On the 20th, we will make communion bread and use that bread for communion on April 24th as the children then make their first communion.

Vision Team:

The Vision Team will meet on April 25 from 7:00-8:30 pm. This is a new group that will be discerning our vision for moving forward to follow the commands of Jesus as we navigate this new time in the church. This committee is made up of a diverse group of people in the church, those who have deep family roots and those who are young and newer to our church.

Developing a vision and mission for the future will involve all of us though. We will be developing some questions to ask you to gain as much feedback from everyone as possible. We ask for your prayer that God will give us discernment as we seek God in developing our vision and mission.
