#### **Pulpit Exchange**:

Pastor Carol and her husband, Pastor Doug will be exchanging opportunities to worship with the people of St. Peter and the people of St. Mark's in Wapakoneta four times over the course of the next year. Our first pulpit exchange will be the third week in September.

Pastor Doug is a Biblical storyteller and often recites the scriptures from memory. He has 40 years of experience as an ordained pastor. Pastor Carol has learned much from him about preaching and being a pastor through their 44 years of marriage. Please come and get to know Pastor Doug.

#### **Committee Spotlight: Youth Group**

This month we are focusing on our youth group that is for students in 8<sup>th</sup>–12<sup>th</sup> grade. The group met in August and made some decisions that they would be interested in forming **"Youth Sundays"** in which they will be the active lay helpers in the service. The youth would be the ushers, the readers, the leaders for the prayers of intercession, and the communion assistant. This would occur on the third Sunday of each month. Youth group would then also meet the third Sunday of each month after church for pizza and a time of fellowship.

The group decided that they would like to host a **pancake breakfast with scrambled eggs before church.** There would be a donation basket and the proceeds would be used to help start the Sunday School fund to purchase a farm or additional animals for the Good Gifts Program. They will be serving **breakfast between 8:45-9:30 on October 8**.

(Due to the pulpit exchange between Pastor Doug and Pastor Carol on the third Sunday in September, the youth will meet on the fourth Sunday to plan for the pancake breakfast.)

#### InReach/OutReach (IROR) Committee:

The IROR committee met on August 28, and discussed that there are couples looking for a church to call home. When Pastor Carol shared that the youth wanted to do a pancake breakfast the committee supported the idea. The committee decided to use this opportunity to invite friends and people that we know are searching for a church to come to the pancake breakfast and then enjoy the opportunity to worship at 10:00. So, the IROR would like to come alongside the youth to make the pancake breakfast an extra Sunday for us to reach out and invite people to check us out and fellowship with us. Also since October 8, is the opening day of Sunday School, this provides an opportunity to invite other families with children to come and participate in Sunday School.

The committee is also looking for ways to be more welcoming as new people come to church. Entering a new church for the first time is very difficult for many people and so I would like to encourage all of us to be more intentional to reach out with words of welcome.

Sunday School starts again on October 8<sup>th</sup>. All are welcome! Come. Grow your faith in Jesus as we journey together and serve others!

#### Lifewise:

Kristy Moore, who is the director for Delphos Lifewise came to speak to the church on August 9 and 13. She thanked the congregation for all that we do to make Lifewise available to the elementary students. The program is now serving around 270 students in grades 1-6. Fifth and sixth graders will be attending at the Presbyterian Church.

#### Move to Narrative Lectionary as Scripture Focus:

Some of the Lutheran Churches have been using the Narrative Lectionary for years. This is different from the Revised Lectionary that we have traditionally used. The Narrative Lectionary focuses on the stories of the Old Testament, New Testament and the book of Acts. What many church members have found is that their Biblical knowledge has improved because they get to hear more of the stories in their context.

The Narrative Lectionary runs in a four-year cycle. Pastor Doug and I along with several other pastors in the area would like to try preaching from it for this next year. During the fall, Old Testament texts are the primary vehicle for proclaiming the biblical story. The gospel readings become primary texts for preaching on the Fourth Sunday of Advent through Easter. After Easter the focus moves to the book of Acts.

Old Testament Focus in September:

September 10- Genesis 2:4b-25 (Garden of Eden) and Mark 1:16-20

September 17- Genesis 18:1-15 and 21:1-7 (Isaac Born to Sarah) and Mark 10:23-27

September 2 - Genesis 32:[9-13] 22-30 (Jacob Wrestles God) and Mark 14:32-36

#### Bible Verse to memorize this month:

Instead of focusing on one verse a week, let's focus on one a month. You are invited to pray over this verse as you memorize it. Ask God to speak to you in this verse.
