A Little Bit of This and That for October...

I spent last week in Pennsylvania at Camp Sesquanota Retreat Center. The four days were spent in a combination of silence, morning, mid-day, and evening prayers, worship, study, and fellowship. There were mostly ten of us- eight Lutheran pastors and two lay women. The time away was rich, especially as we studied about a theologian's writing on the nature of sin and God's calling us back to him in grace.

On Wednesday, in a two-hour block of silence, I went for a short walk around the camp and I found the wonder and joy of faith in God just bubbling up in me. I began to quietly sing a new melody as the words for a refrain began to form. As I sang, "Oh it's amazing, amazing grace that calls me back to you," I began to sing out phrases to form verses. I went back to my room and began to write and quietly sing in my head. God gave me a hymn about the God breathed life that begins with our faith in Jesus and moves deeper into the reliance on the Holy Spirit.

Each day, we have the opportunity to pause and breathe in God. We can ask for more of Jesus' grace in our lives and we can ask for the Holy Spirit to give us the living water that God offers to those who believe in Jesus. This living water is deeply spiritual in that it fills a void in us so that we can experience the grace of God at work in us, even when the times in our lives may be challenging.

As we have begun to learn the stories of Hebrew Bible, we can see how God is at work in the midst of people just like you and me. We learn the Adam and Eve were tempted and disobeyed God and hid in shame, but God was faithful to come looking for them. We learned that Abraham and Sarah struggled with disappointment in not having children. For 24 years they followed God as best they could, and only when it would seem totally impossible did God intervene to have Sarah have a son. God made a promise to Abraham and it was in God's timing to fulfill that promise. We hear the story of Jacob who wrestled with God and in that wrestling God changed him and gave him a new name.

These stories are important because we can relate to their struggle. We know shame. We know disappointment. We know fear and anxiety. But as we entrust our lives to the work of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we can experience peace and joy and transformation, even in the hardest of times.
