A Little Bit of This and That for December...

Does it seem like time is moving faster and faster? Many of you just received your November newsletter and yet the December letter is now here. Our days are marked by time and routine. We expect certain things to happen at certain times and when they don't, we are often found to be off kilter.

So, what is this time of Advent about? Is it a time when our lives move on as normal or is something different asked of us? Doug and I often find ourselves busier during this season. We set out the Advent candles but find that often we are so busy that we go days without lighting them.

According to Wikipedia, "Advent is a season observed in most Christian denominations as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ at the Second Coming. Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year in Western Christianity. "The word, Advent means "coming" and is derived from the Latin word adventus, which is a translation of the Greek word parousia."

So, if Advent is to be a time of expectant waiting for the coming of Christ, my question becomes how to we wait? And... how do we ask for Jesus to come to us, to our friends and family, to our communities, and the world?

How do we wait expecting Jesus to show up in our midst? This year, Doug and I will probably not set up the Advent candles this year, but we will light candles in our home. We will carve out time in our quiet time to pray and ask Jesus to come. One of the simplest prayers to pray is **"Come, Lord, Jesus."**

I am proposing that during this Advent time of waiting we all pray this prayer throughout the day. We can pray it when we first open our eyes in the morning, and we can pray it silently on the school bus or in our cars. We can pray it silently at home sitting in our recliner or at work. We can pray it in our play and in our gatherings. The important thing is to pray it with the expectation that Jesus will show up in our midst, not only as the Christ child, but as our risen Lord who has the power to truly bring peace and goodwill to all.

May the grace, love, and presence of Jesus be with you all during this time of waiting.
